

All animal response team volunteers in Kansas are required to be trained on basic emergency preparedness.

Required Training

- Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Independent Study (IS) 100: Introduction to Incident Command System
- 2. FEMA IS 200: ICS for Single Resources and Initial Action Incidents
- 3. FEMA IS 700: Introduction to NIMS
- 4. School of Public Health at University at Albany (SUNY): County Animal Response Team
- 5. Animal First Aid (CE every 2 years)
- 6. Human First Aid (CE every 2 years)
- 7. Psychological First Aid (CE every 5 years)

Additional Requirements


- All animal response team volunteers in Kansas must have a go bag (so they can deploy at a moment's notice and not further drain the resources of the affected community).
- Animal response team volunteers in Kansas must have no previous conviction of animal cruelty.

<u>Introduction to Position Descriptions</u>

The following position descriptions include the *additional minimum* requirements for volunteers to become credentialed for an animal response team position. To be credentialed in a particular position, a responder must meet all criteria for the specified position. If, however, a volunteer has considerable experience relevant to the position, some training requirements can be waived. Credentialing is a *pre-incident* activity.

Upon completion of the basic training requirements, a volunteer may enroll in further training in advanced techniques. It is possible, and highly likely, that a volunteer be responsible for more than one position. It is recommended that after completing the basic training requirements, volunteers receive additional training and practice these techniques at a minimum of two to three times per year to ensure retention.







Position: Animal Case Manager (Reunion Manager)

- Daily reports to SCART Team Leader.
- Timely communication with state board of veterinary medicine and state veterinary medical association.

- Responsible for Resource unit, Risk assessment, Mapping Epidemiology,
 Documenting and disease reporting, Vaccination evaluations, Animal welfare,
 Laboratory administration, Legal issues, Environmental and economic impact
 assessment, Weather predictions

Position: Animal Team Leader

Supervisor: IC

Description:

• Overall authority and responsibility for conducting incident operations.

- Responsible for the management of all incident operations at the incident site.
- Will coordinate SCART's response to the incident with the overall Incident Commander.
- Will work with the Planning Officer to plan SCART's response to the incident.
- Establishes An Incident Command Post, Mission statement, Immediate goals,
- Supervises planning meetings.
- Ensures incident safety.
- Coordinates and approves activities of command and general staff.
- Approves the release of information to the public.
- Approves and implements the Incident Action Plan of the Day.
- Coordinates the end of the incident.

Position: Animal Volunteer Coordinator

Supervisor: Animal Team Leader

Description:

- Responsible for all facets of the volunteer program.
- Participate in organizational activities; assessing every opportunity for recruitment.
- Execute volunteer orientations on a periodic basis.
- Maintain records of volunteer information to include training completed and immunizations.
- Participate in the committee to provide volunteer mentoring and support.
- Maintain record of volunteer hours donated.
- Assist training committee to ensure all volunteers complete mandatory requirements.
- Visit and speak at local organization meetings.
